Illinois Department of Public Health Immunization Requirements for Institutions Of Higher Education in Illinois

It is <u>mandatory</u> for all incoming students attending the Lebanon campus to show documentation of immunity to <u>Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (M.M.R.)</u> prior to enrollment. Two doses of live measles vaccine should be given on or after the first birthday, at least one month apart, or evidence of measles immunity (i.e. prior physician diagnosed measles or laboratory evidence of immunity). If second dose is necessary, it must be given as a M.M.R. History of the disease is <u>NOT</u> acceptable as proof of immunity for <u>Rubella</u>.

It is also <u>mandatory</u> for incoming new students to document childhood immunity to Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis prior to enrollment. A <u>Tetanus</u> <u>Diphtheria</u> booster must have been within the past 10 years.

This information is included on the McKendree University Confidential Medical Exam form given to all incoming students who have received their letters of acceptance. After completion of a Doctor's physical exam and documentation of immunizations, the medical form <u>must</u> be turned into Health Services <u>prior</u> to registration for classes.

American College Health Association highly recommends all incoming first year students be immunized for the prevention of <u>Meningococcal Meningitis</u>,

<u>Hepatitis B</u> and <u>Varicella</u> (chicken pox) if the student has no previous history of chicken pox.

McKendree University Programs, including Aim, Scott and Kentucky do not follow under these guidelines and are therefore exempt.
