McKendree University accepts credit for college level knowledge as demonstrated by passing grades on the exams offered by the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) according to the guidelines below:

Subject Examinations:

- Elective credit will not be awarded at any time for DANTES subject examinations that either duplicate or precede courses taken in residence or transferred to McKendree University.
- Credit may be awarded towards both major/minor and core requirements as well as elective hours.
- Application of credit for DANTES subject examinations toward a major or minor is at the discretion of the appropriate division with each division determining the criteria for acceptance.

Procedure:

- 1. If you have questions about taking a DANTES exam or wish to request a transcript, please contact DANTES http://www.dantes.doded.mil.
- 2. Make arrangements with a nearby DANTES Center to take the examination.
- 3. Have the results of the examination sent to McKendree University in care of the Office of Academic Records. The code number for McKendree University is **9271**.
- 4. Scores usually take 3 to 4 weeks before they reach the University. If the scores are acceptable, the credit will be posted on your official McKendree University transcript.
- 5. If the report shows that you did not attain the necessary scores, you may take the exam again in six months.

McKendree University must receive an official copy of the DANTES score in order to process and post the credit.
